

Easter Message 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We think of the word "Easter" as a noun, but the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins once used it as a verb. "Let him Easter in us," Hopkins wrote in his 1875 poem "The Wreck of the Deutschland," in which he recounted a shipwreck off the English coast that resulted in the death of five Franciscan nuns.

I was taught that a verb is an action word or one that expresses a state of being. It is intriguing to think of Easter as a verb, as something that is present and active here and now. Of course, we know that Easter refers to the great mystery of Jesus rising from the dead, bursting out of the tomb after having died on the cross for our salvation. But Hopkins' use of Easter as a verb reveals another level of meaning: to say "let him Easter in us" is to proclaim that we share in the great mystery and victory of Christ. We are not mere spectators at the foot of the cross or at the empty tomb. Easter is not for Christ alone but is shared with all who believe in him. To have him "Easter in us" is to know there is something more to life than this human life, and something beyond death – that the grave does not have the last word. To have him "Easter in us" is to be freed from sin so as to live a new life for God.

Whatever troubles and worries may oppress us, whatever challenges afflict the Church and the world, we have a new way of being because Christ rose from the dead. That is Easter as a verb; something that impacts our entire life and the way we act in the world. To paraphrase the poet, may Christ Easter in you during this holy season and always.

Dear Friends of La Verna,

Peace and All Good! Finally it seems as if spring has begun to arrive here in Peterborough and the Kawartha's, for myself the harbingers of the change of season are the return of the robins and of course the appearance of buckets clinging to Maple trees when I travel outside of Peterborough. Maple syrup season has begun, ergo spring is arriving in its fullness. As Lent is a season of conversion, transition and turning our lives toward our Lord God, so Easter is the season of renewal and return to new life and the fulfillment of the promises of Lent, even the air smells and feels fresher lately.

Here at La Verna our Lenten retreats were modest yet quite successful and our Lenten Wednesday Guided Meditations also have garnered a small gathering of seekers, such that our modest Chapel has been comfortably full. We are anticipating our first Easter here in the Diocese of Peterborough and the Easter events which the Diocese is offering, especially the Chrism Mass and Way of the Cross. We encourage you to come out and support your Diocese's Easter events with an open heart seeking God's grace and continuing conversion.

As we look beyond Easter, Bro Stephen and I are looking into what other spiritual offerings we are able to bring to you through out the warmer months ahead. One of the first of these is coming in May, and that will be the return of the 'Holy Relics' of St. Pio to our Diocese. The month of May is also St Pio's birth month, he was born on 25 May, 1887. It is also a month dedicated to the B.V.M, to whom St Pio had a deep devotion. The relics we hope, will be able to visit one parish in each Deanery on the Saturday of each weekend. In between, they will of course be available for veneration in our La Verna Chapel (all times and details to be announced in the very near future).

We also are discussing the possibility of developing new programs for the fall, possibilities include a presentation or workshop on the Social Justice teachings of the Church, maybe a Psalms course and an Information Day for anyone interested in the Secular Franciscans (formerly the Third Order) among others... all will be revealed in the fulness of time as it is said.

We also want to acknowledge and thank all those who have come out over the past eight months since our arrival, and who welcomed us to the Diocese and supported our initial retreats and spiritual programs, and in particular those parishes who have invited and welcomed us into their local parish communities.

May the Blessings of the Resurrection Enlighten Your hearts

Dear Friends;

A new season is upon us, there is change in the air. The robins are back searching for worms and grubs in the earth that is no longer frozen and covered in snow. Soon new life will bud forth in the trees and flowers will once again bloom. This new life brings with it excitement and a sense of hope. We live in a changing world, a world created by God, and it is good. "God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day." (Genesis 1:31) Let us embrace the goodness of what God created out of love, through love, and for love. We are part of God's creation, as so we are created for love, that is to love, and to be loved. This is the only thing God asks of us.

We tend to over think our actions often trying to justify denying love, because love in a world of sin can sometimes feel uncomfortable. In order to have the fullness of love we need to embrace the uncomfortable, this is what love calls us to do. St. Francis received the gift of understanding this when he embraced the leper, as he writes in his Testament "When I was in sin, the sight of lepers nauseated me beyond measure; but then God himself led me into their company, and I had pity on them. When I had once become acquainted with them, what had previously nauseated me became a source of spiritual and physical consolation for me. After that I did not wait long before leaving the world." The leper of Francis' world was separated from the society and cast out, because of fear. They were not welcomed in society. They were denied love. Denying anyone of love is the definition of sin. Jesus tells us to "love our neighbors as our self" and he makes it clear that our neighbor is not just those with whom we agree or share a common opinion with but rather all people and indeed all of the created universe!

I leave you with the following to contemplate. Who is your leper? Who do you need to embrace? Who needs to feel love and be welcomed into our churches and homes. Who has been made to feel cast out? Who have we denied our love?
